# S3 Who is responsible for good - Highlights/Notes

#### **EGW**

- God gives us this life on Earth, that we may develop our character and reap the result of our choices, whether good or bad.
- God is responsible for all things good. He gives us the free will to make our own choices and live with the consequences of them.
- God is life, and He shows/is the perfect example of a perfect life. So, if you are not connected with God, you are not following and in harmony with the "perfect lifestyle", thus you are technically not living. God loved us so much that he shared his free will with us, so we can develop who and what we want to be through our decisions and through them we are "judged" and take the consequences. However, Satan cannot resist God's love and he will be destroyed by Him.
- We are all depending on God every day and moment. Without Him we wouldn't be able to live or breath.
- we ourselves are the evidence of God's Creation. Every breath we take and every word we speak must be dependent on God.
- Although God has created everything and everyone, we still depend on Him to be able to function and carry out our duties; we compare it (until a certain point) to Newton's first law: "An object at rest stays at rest and an object in motion stays in motion with the same speed and in the same direction unless acted upon by an unbalanced force," where God is the force that moves us every day, every moment, without God's interference, everything and everyone would stop "moving"; everything that happens is within God's control and permission, and everything happens because of him, without his permission, nothing would happen.
- We realize how God has control over everything, even the smallest elements. Without God's interference, we "would die and return to the dust of the earth," but thanks to God's grace, we are (everything and everyone) renewed in his presence.
- God the father is not just our creator. He is the ultimate provider. Every pleasure and life we enjoy comes from God
- God is the creator of everything and everyone. And all the things that reflect and demand emotion, reflect the permission of God and his life. For God owns life and He himself is life, so we are not worthy of living because it does not belong to us, but God with all His grace allows us to live and interact with His creation.

# S4 Who is responsible for evil - Highlights/Notes

#### **EGW**

- Those who reject God and live a life of rebellion separate themselves from God and choose death and darkness instead of light and life.
- when we let ourselves be vulnerable both physically and mentally, Satan attacks the weak points of us. Jesus however was able to rule over Satan's temptation. So we must keep our faith strong and ask God's mercy.
- Even when Christ was at the weakest stage of His life, Satan did not prevail. His faith is the infinite power that nothing can defeat it. Satan attacks humans' weakness: lack of faith.
- God could have destroyed Satan, but He is not a tyrant. He has mercy and great love for everyone, including Satan.
- Every action, thought, or lie that Satan tempts us with not only hurts us, but those around us, the people who love us, and most of all, God, because we belong to Him.
- What Satan did had made people tempted to sin and he will do anything and everything to keep us sinning.
- God gave his son to the world in order to stop sin, and he will come back when the gospel is preached to the whole world.
- The ten commandments shouldn't be seen as a way to punish you for doing it but as a way to be happy in obedience.
- Ten commandments are not a checklist of laws that is given by God, but they can guide and improve us. Accepting Christ purifies our souls and brings us eternal life.

- I don't think it means the prophet is evil. Usually prophets are unliked because they tell people to correct their ways. People do not like to be corrected so they do not like prophets. But Jeaus was accepted and welcomed to Galilee. I don't see how this says who is responsible for evil?
- Those who do not accept the message of Jesus or the prophets do not accept the message because their deeds are evil and they do not want to change their ways.
- we have to let God in our lives. He is our shepherd and we have to be his sheep ready to be guided with what he has to say.
- Satan is the one responsible for evil. He is so sure that Job will renounce God, so God tells him to test Job that he can do whatever he wants except kill Job. I think one of the most important things to note from this verse is that Job's wife tell Job to curse God he tells her shall we only accept good from God and not trouble

- even when Satan himself attacks Job and all of his possessions and family and his loved ones were against him he still held strong and did not curse God.
- At that time, the opening of the sheepfold was very narrow and there was only one opening. This allows the gatekeeper to easily control which animals enter and exit. Anyone who tries to enter a pen or take an animal out of the door through another path is a thief by definition.
- Jesus compares false prophets and some people as thieves and robbers because they were impure and condemned just like them, and we enjoyed a life and hope that did not belong to us by right, but Jesus did not become corrupted like the others.
- The king of the kyre became proud and was no longer blameless.
- Because of the violence he did and he is so proud, God gives him punishment.
- Evil goes to hell, those who are righteous will go to heaven. All was good until Lucifer, who had been disgusted as a star.
- Satan is responsible for evil and he is ready to snatch up anyone who is standing by God's side
- The devil and his angels came to the earth to deceive, kill and destroy. So that God's people can't be saved.
- There are a lot of earthly desires of humans and those lead humans to be sinful. God gave them a choice and they chose to be sinful with their deprayed minds.

# **S5 God's role in our choices - Highlights/Notes**

#### **EGW**

- God loves and respects us enough to let us make our own decisions and never forces His will, even if it might be the better choice or the greater good. God of heaven is above all other gods
- God gave us freedom to think and to follow him and in Christ's kingdom there is no oppression of any sort nor any sort of behavior checks, the angels come as messengers of his mercy.
- God wants humanity to be independent thinkers and to think for themselves. There is no room for oppression and conflict in his kingdom, you don't have to conform with how someone else wants you to be.
- God does not want us to be deprived from freedom. We shall not control one another nor judge one another nor order another. That is not our purpose. He wants us use our free will and think for ourselves but do so justly by following his word
- Every soul is known to Jesus, because He died for each of them salvation. Jesus wants us to know His voice, because He sees all our hearts and knows who we are. His Holy Spirit will always be with us to draw us nearer to Jesus.
- Our faith, righteous works, and humility in God will strengthen us and will allow us to enter God's kingdom.
- God is love, and love cannot be commanded. He can destroy or smite Satan and all who follow evil not by forces but instead through love and kindness.
- Even if you are not "aligned" or apart Christianity or people you say they serve God, God knows your heart and can recognize that you are one of His children. Even if you are completely ignorant of His existence.
- If you are a breathing organism, you count as a child of God. You do not have to be a supposed christian, or a frequent scripture reader, in order to be loved by Him.
- God brings light to the world. God is the Sun of the Righteousness who can heal the dark world. People misapprehend God's purpose of putting dark into existence
- The influence of the divine Spirit is a blessing. Our works are evidence that the Holy Spirit lives in us and that we are the children of God.
- Without the love of Christ, everything we do is mute.
- Doing something as simple as admiring God through our actions, gives us strength to do something as complex as sharing His message.
- The only condition of discipleship and service that Christ asked is to love Him. This passage ties with 1 Corinthians 13:3 "If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that

- You have the free will to resist God's love and may resist Christ. But if you choose to accept God and be drawn to Christ you will be led to the path of salvation and repentance. Christ died painfully on the cross for our sins.

- whoever believes in God will not be condemned, because they have recognized that he is the light.
- Christ has the power to change us from slaves to sin to a part of the family, because he's the Son of God.
- God gives us the decision to choose him or to not choose him, along with every other choice, he gives us endless options.
- God gave us free will so we can truly love and choose him. He wants us to find Him from our own will. He never leaves us.
- God is always on our side, even when we don't choose him. Because that's the way he is, he's always there for us
- You don't need to be within the religious circle in order to be able to choose to be with God, and being within the religious circle doesn't guarantee that you are with God. It's what's on your heart that counts.
